Model a good work ethic...

"...Nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you. It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate." ~2 Thessalonians 3:8-9

- Have a servant's heart (Phil. 2:5-9)
- Serve joyfully (Deut 28:47)
- Take pleasure in your work (Ecc 5:19)
- Work heartily as if it's for God (Col 3:23)

 Encourage your boys to excel in something – not necessarily school.

A work ethic

•If you make a mess, you clean the mess.

- Don't berate them when they don't do things according to your standard. Train cheerfully. Encourage.
- Don't make work into a punishment. Make it a rewarding experience.
- Demonstrate a cheerful work ethic. Do you serve your husband and children cheerfully? Are you a good example?
- If you make a mess, you clean a mess. Discuss what this will look like for each project.
